THE RISE OF VLOGGERS

Vlogging is short for video blogging. A blog that uses video is called a vlog. The first one was posted online by American Adam Kontras in 2000, but vlogging only became popular after 2005, when YouTube was created. If you are interested in becoming a vlogger, you just need a webcam, an internet connection and a few hours every day to keep your vlog updated.

Anyone can make a vlog. However, making good videos is not as easy as it looks. Successful vloggers have to work hard to live up to their fans' expectations – most of them post new vlogs several times a week. Vloggers interact with their audience – they ask them questions and they get immediate feedback. Therefore, they have to manage to read all this feedback so that they know what viewers like the most. If the viewers like the vloggers and their work, they are more likely to share their videos – the more shares vloggers get, the more money they will make from advertising. It's easy to make a vlog, but the most successful are the ones that have very good stuff. Their earnings can come up to more than \$100,000 a year! If you see one of their vlogs by chance and then decide to follow them, you are helping them to make just a little more money.


CHARLIE MCDONNELL



Charlie McDonnell was the first British online superstar – he got into vlogging in 2007, when he was a shy sixteen-year-old schoolboy, and since then his videos have been viewed more than 250 million times. His viewers recognise him in the street and when he attends vlogging events, thousands of fans come so they can see 'the real him'. His vlogs have been so

successful that when he was eighteen, instead of going to university, he decided to make a living from his vlogs. He became a full-time vlogger and now earns more than his parents. His vlogs cover all sorts of topics, such as 'How to make tea'.

Have you come across Lex Croucher? She's a twenty-two-year-old student. The number of subscribers to her channel *Tyrannosauruslexxx* comes to 76,000. At first, her vlogs were autobiographical.
