<u>Digital habits across generations</u>
Today's grandparents are joining their grandchildren (1) social media, but the different generations' online habits couldn't be more different. In the UK the over-55s are joining Facebook in increasing numbers, meaning that they will soon be (2) site's second biggest user group, with 3.5 million users aged 55–64 and 2.9 million over-65s.
Sheila, aged 59, says, 'I joined to see what my grandchildren are doing, as videos and photos of them are posted (3) my daughter. It's a much better way to see what they're doing (4) waiting for letters and photos in the post.' Ironically, Sheila's grandchildren are less likely

Hedy Lamarr and WiFi

dishwasher, the car heater, or who were the first people to write algorithms
and make coding easier? They (2) (be) all women
inventors! Usually when we (3) (talk) about inventors,
people like Thomas Edison or Alexander Graham Bell come to mind. But
women inventors were equally amazing! For example, I (4)

without the work of a woman: Hedy Lamarr.
Hedy Lamarr was born in Vienna and acted in a few Austrian films in her short film career. In 1937,
she (5) (leave) her husband, a rich Austrian ammunition manufacturer,
secretly moving to London. While she (6) (live) there, she met Louis B.
Mayer, head of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer (MGM) studio, who offered her a Hollywood movie contract
and began promoting her as 'the world's most beautiful woman'.
Hedy Lamarr was also an inventor. During World War II, she thought of creating a signal that (7)
(use a modal verb - control) torpedoes. So she and her friend George Antheil
started to work on the early version of spread-spectrum communication and patented it in 1942.
However, the US Navy (8) (not want) to implement any inventions coming
from outside the military. But it was used later on Navy ships during the Cuban Missile Crisis in
1962. Today, many of these techniques (9) (incorporate) into Bluetooth
technology and are similar to methods used in Wi-Fi.
Because of the value of their work, Hedy and George were incorporated into the National Inventors
Hall of Fame in 2014. If you travel to Washington, you (10) (be able) to see
